As we headed toward the counselling room, she thought to herself, 'Ah... a lecture first before a scolding.'

However, when she opened the door, her classmates screamed 'Surprise!' and took turns to give her a welcome hug. Nancy was speechless and soon she had tears in her eyes as she heard stories about a recent class camp and the troubles some of her friends were getting into while tucking into pizza and cola. It was a party she had come back to and when the fun and laughter simmered, everyone got into a circle and took turns to share a memory, a feeling or a wish that they had about Nancy. Most said that they missed her and wished that she was back at school. One person reminded her that together with a few others, they had made a pact at the beginning of the year to stick together until they left school. The pact was based on the belief that when friends stuck together they could achieve anything.

Some of Nancy's friends did more than then just speak, they handed her a letter. Will just copy a selection of sentences from the various letters below:

But, in the same breath she added with steely determination, 'The plan next week is that I will call 2 others at 5am and together, we will come to your home to wake you up and walk to school together.'

Nancy requested for the school timetable and her name tag. She will report to school on Monday.
